FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

Fort McMurray looms large in the collective consciousness of all Canadians. Whether or not we have ever been to or worked there, or know someone else who has (and probably a surprisingly large percentage of us fall into one of those categories), our lives have all been affected either directly or indirectly by Fort McMurray. All of us have benefited from the outsized impact the Alberta oil sands has had on our economy. Fort McMurray has for decades figured prominently in our national debates over politics, pipelines, and, as the climate crisis has become ever more dire, the environment. Fort McMurray and its history also provide a telling exemplar of our country's historical relationship to our land and natural resources, and to the peoples who lived here before colonization.

Like all the characters in Wood Buffalo, we have each, actively or passively, formed and continue to negotiate our individual relationship to Fort McMurray and all that it represents. In them, we might see our own dilemmas and choices writ large. Whatever place we occupy on the political spectrum, most of us probably have an opinion (and perhaps a strong one) about Fort McMurray. This play began out of a desire to test and question my own preconceptions about the place. Over the last five tumultuous years (for Fort McMurray, Canada, and the world) that I've spent working on the play, some of my previous opinions have been reinforced, while others have evolved and changed. If I've succeeded with the play, I'm hoping you might have something of the same experience watching it, and that it might also inspire some thought about the crisis we find ourselves in. With any luck, you'll have an entertaining night out, too.

I'm extremely grateful to Artistic Director Natasha MacLellan and the entire team at Theatre New Brunswick for giving me this opportunity, and for their support throughout the process. Huge thanks to director Rob Kempson and the amazing performers who have brought the play to life. My thanks also to all those who participated in previous workshops of the script, and to playwright colleagues who have offered thoughts on the script along the way: Michael Healey, Colleen Murphy, Anna Chatterton, and Meg Braem. I am also grateful to the Playwrights Atlantic Resource Centre for development support received through its Home Delivery program. Lastly but very importantly, I am forever indebted to the many McMurrayites from all walks of life that I spoke to for sharing their thoughts, secrets, and stories about Wood Buffalo with me.

A versatile vocalist, she is formally trained in classical and jazz styles, and holds 2 Silver Medals from the Royal Conservatory of Music. Bridget is a published songwriter, a member of SOCAN, and a recipient of a New Talent Grant from FACTOR (Foundation to Assist Canadian Talent on Record). In 2022, she completed a certificate in arts and culture management at the University of New Brunswick.
