



About the Play

Rebecca Schofield, the Riverview girl known by her nickname Becca, has an exceptional story of courage. Diagnosed with a brain tumor at the age of 15, she initiated a worldwide kindness movement in over 94 countries through the #BeccaToldMeTo campaign.

Based on her story, and with the complicity of her family, author Mélanie Léger has written this documentary drama about Becca's inspiring and all-too-short life.





Mélanie LeBlanc


Actress

Bianca Richard


Actress



Becca will be her third appearance in a TPA production, her fourth if we count the co-production Les Jumeaux d'Arcadie, but it will be her first collaboration with TNB.
