
# THEATRE NEW BRUNSWICK SEASON 24/25

# Message from Chair, Board of Governors Deborah Burns

History is littered with attempts to glean glory from the unspeakable horrors of war. This is how we cope. This is how we heal. And sadly, this is how we forget. This is also what makes Bluebirds unique among war stories. This play is not about brave soldiers, cunning generals, or ignorant politicians. It's a story about how our mothers, our grandmothers, and our great grandmothers were able to find community and share comfort with the injured, the sick, the dying and each other.

Vern Thiessen is a master of his craft. Using one of the greatest tragedies in world history as inspiration, he has found light where little exists; humour in the face of unspeakable horror; and in crafting three distinct characters, he offers us both a new perspective and a truly original take on the war stories we have grown accustomed to hearing. Bluebirds is a story about love and tragedy and caring and loss and hope. I believe each of us here in the theatre tonight will find a connection in our own lives to these characters and this story. My hope is that you leave the theatre richer than when you arrived.





# **Vern Thiessen - Playwright**

Vern Thiessen is one of Canada's most produced playwrights. His plays have been translated into five languages and have been seen around the world. Vern is the recipient of the Dora Mavor Moore and Elizabeth Sterling Haynes awards for Outstanding New Play, the Carol Bolt Award, the Gwen Pharis Ringwood Award, and the Governor General's Literary Award for Drama, Canada's highest honour for a playwright. He has served as president of both the Playwrights Guild of Canada and the Writers Guild of Alberta and was artistic director of Workshop West Playwrights' Theatre for six seasons. He is married to acclaimed screenwriter and novelist Susie Moloney.



## Natasha MacLellan - Director

Natasha MacLellan's love of new scripts was fostered through Playwrights Atlantic Resource Centre where she mentored with Jenny Munday. From there she started Forerunner Playwrights Theatre, which produced new works in Halifax for a decade followed by six seasons as the Artistic Producer of Ship's Company Theatre. Before she became a full time producer, Natasha worked as an actor, director, teacher and dramaturge, and she still does those things, when she can.



Kirsten Alter - Maggie

Kirsten (she/her) was born and raised in Quispamsis, N.B. She is super excited to step back into Maggie's shoes with this beautiful cast and crew. Recent theatre: Dance Nation (Keep Good Theatre Company/HEIST), Intimate Apparel (Thousand Islands Playhouse), Wildly Romantic (The Foster Festival). Bluebirds; All I Want For Christmas (TNB). From Marvel to PBS Kid's, Milk Bone to NOOM, to being the voice of Easy Financial, when she's not on the stage, she's happy to be in the studio with her headphones and mic.



Mélanie LeBlanc - Bab

Mélanie is a versatile performer who has played many well-loved characters over the years, such as Marry Poppins, Pierrette Guérin, The Wicked Witch of the West, Lady Macbeth, Patsy Cline, Anne of Green Gables, and the notorious pirate Ann Bonny. For seven years, she crooned in Vietnam, Japan, the Maldives and India, and has toured her one-woman show Hommage aux femmes de la guerre (Women in Wartime) across Canada and in France. Mélanie is a recipient of the Robert Merritt award. This winter, she will be performing in a Christmas show at Le Pays de la Sagouine in Buctouche, NB. Mélanie is grateful to be part of the telling of this important story with this remarkable team.



# Sharisse LeBrun - Christy

Sharisse LeBrun (she/her) is a theatre educator, director, and performer based in New Brunswick where she works as Theatre New Brunswick's Theatre School and Young Company Director. Training: University of Toronto, MA in Drama, Theatre, and Performance, St. Thomas University. Directing: Beneath Springhill: The Maurice Ruddick Story, Sidewalk Chalk, S.T.O.P, Altar (TNB YOCO) and The Spongebob Musical, Romeo & Juliet, Rose, The Little Prince, Anne & Gilbert, Little Women (TNB Theatre School). Acting: Cath-Ann & Gloria in The Company Store (Theatre Baddeck), Jane Bingley in Miss Bennett: Christmas at Pemberley and Christy in Bluebirds (TNB). Sharisse has been part of the development of Bluebirds since 2020 and is grateful to be bringing Christy back to life once again with this incredible team.



# **Chelsea Dickie - Stage Manager**

Chelsea Dickie (she/her) is a multifaceted arts manager and educator based out of Kjipuktuk/Halifax (originally from Sipekne'katik / South Maitland, NS). Chelsea has worked all across Mi'kma'ki for the past 10 years, with different theatre companies in a wide array of roles. Stage and production manager, arts administrator/manager, drama educator, and outreach coordinator. She is also a founder and producer for her own indie theatre company Matchstick Theatre, which has staged 14 major productions since 2017, all of which Chelsea stage managed. When not producing her own shows, Chelsea has been a go-to stage manager around Kjipuktuk/Halifax, having worked with such companies as 2b theatre, Neptune Theatre, Nestuita'si Storytelling, Villain's Theatre, Workshirt Opera, The Doppler Effect, and Festival Antigonish. She is incredibly excited to add TNB to that list, and join up with such a beautiful team and production!




# **Sherry Kinnear - Costume Designer**

**Christian Ludwig Hanson - Projection Designer** 

Christian (He/Him) is a theatre creator and performer with special focus in collaboration, puppetry, stage combat, and projection design. He is from Northern Friesland by the German-Danish border and now lives in Kjipuktuk/Halifax. He is a recent graduate from the Acting program at Dalhousie.



Stewart Legere - Sound Designer

Stewart Legere is a multidisciplinary artist situated between Kjipuktuk/Halifax and Tkaronto/Toronto. He is the Co-Artistic Director of Live Art company The Accidental Mechanics Group and Associate Artistic Director of ZUPPA. His performances have been presented at theatres and festivals across Canada and the internationally. He is a vocalist with orchestral pop outfit The Heavy Blinkers, and a solo singer/songwriter ("Quiet the Station" - 2017, "To the Bone" - 2020). He composes music and sound for theatre and film. An avid and passionate collaborator, his work is fascinated with vulnerability, intimacy, the destruction of persona and the celebration of performance. He is currently an artist-in-residence at The Theatre Centre in Toronto.



**Chris Saad - Lighting Designer**

Andrea has been nominated two times for Toronto's Dora Awards and the proud recipient of a Dora Award for Outstanding Set Design.



# Sarah Power - Choreographer

Originally from Saint John, Sarah has been working as a professional independent dance artist and teacher since graduating from Toronto Metropolitan University in 2001. She is a founding member and current Artistic Director of Connection Dance Works. Her career has included collaborations with musicians, dancers, filmmakers, play writes, designers and visual artists. She has received grants for Professional Development, Residencies and Creation projects through the Canada Council for the Arts and artsnb. Sarah continues to learn and develop work through her practice of Authentic Movement, a way of discovering movement inherent in the body instead of inventing it.

# **Nicole Flynn - Production Assistant**


